#### From soup cans to silk screens

The year is set on the heels of the Great Depression in the late 1930's in downtown Pittsburgh. A little boy sits at his dining room table sketching and reading comic books. This scene was often a reality for a boy named Andrew Warhola, later recognized as Andy Warhol. He didn't know it at the time, but he would go on for decades inspiring generations by bringing flashes of color and new art forms to a once dreary world.

Andy Warhol is now known for his wild hair, exotic forms of art, and crazy controversies. However, his life was not always so glamorous or exciting. He had very humble beginnings as a first generation American born child to immigrant parents from Slovakia. In 1928, during the Great Depression, Andrew Warhola was born as the youngest of three brothers. He suffered from chronic illnesses throughout his childhood, often succumbing to dizziness or involuntary movements, which required him to stay at home for weeks on end.

His mother would comfort him by bringing him comic books and drawings she had done for him. In his early art works, it was clear that Andrew had gathered inspiration from these tender moments with his mother. During his late teen years, Andrew's father passed away. His father's last wish was for his son, Andrew, to continue his education.

Andrew was accepted into Carnegie Institute of Technology, now known as Carnegie Mellon, in downtown Pittsburgh. However, he struggled with college and almost dropped out his first year. A kind professor took sympathy on Andrew and allowed him to make up his work. Graduating with a degree in Pictorial Design, Andrew moved to New York and began seriously advertising his art work with the help of his mother. Why does the world only know him as Andy Warhol then? In the midst of his complex life, the story is simple- a publisher accidentally misspelled his name, forever changing how future generations would remember this remarkable artist.

Most of his well known works include a Campbell's soup can, copied in many bright colors that other artists wouldn't have thought was artistic. To most people, especially Pittsburghers, Campbell's soup was an American household staple, which was the exact message Warhol wanted to portray. He constantly thought of a day in the life as a typical American and how people perceive things in different ways. Not only was his portrayal of the once-thought-to-be-regular-object new and interesting to all, but his technique of reproducing art in a print-like way was radical and allowed art to be created quicker. Use of inanimate objects and reproducing images in color using print was something that no one else had thought of at that time.

Andy Warhol also gained popularity through controversial thoughts and actions like same sex interests and relationships, nudity, drug use, excessive alcohol use and other eccentric behaviors. His support of these indulgences helped others openly embrace similar interests. Unfortunately, fame and a bizarre lifestyle also made Warhol a hypocrite. Andy was known to steal artistic ideas from others without giving proper credit to the originator and he was known to treat others poorly, which may have lead to him getting shot at one point. *Continued on page 3*

Recently, students took a field trip with Mrs. Finberg to vidit the museum. One sophomore, Owen Stillwell, shared why he enjoyed the field trip. "It's a typical underdog story since Warhol came from nothing. He captures the culture of the period very well so it's important in a retrospective sense." Decades later, interest in Warhol's life and art work is still prominent. In 2022, Warhol's silk screen painting of Marilyn Monroe's face sold in under four minutes of bidding, for \$195 million, making it the highest priced American work of art sold at an auction. #### Save the shrews

There are a lot of endangered species in the world. There are also a lot in Pennsylvania. Animals are losing their habitats due to development in housing, agriculture, and energy. Climate change is another big cause for loss of habitat and it affects the species in ways no one can fully predict.

One animal that is endangered is the bog turtle. The bog turtle can be found in southeastern Pennsylvania. With already low numbers, the bog turtle is at great risk of extinction. They have been under the endangered list since 1997. Their main cause of being endangered is fragmentation and forest succession.

Another animal, the Indiana bat, feeds during the winter, in 19 sites. They have habitat losses due to a wide-variety of land development and land use practices that remove forest. They've been listed as an endangered species since 1966.

The American water shrew, more commonly known as the water shrew, is also an endangered animal. The shrew has lost its habitat. They live in the southwestern part of Pennsylvania, found on a few sites such as the Allegheny Plateau.

An animal called the long-eared owl is vulnerable to disturbance of roosts, known as an owl's resting place; increased human activities around roosts have led to abandonment.

The northern flying squirrel also suffers from habitat loss because of lots of downed woody debris. Along with the flying squirrel, the delmarva fox squirrel is losing their habitat due to development and timber harvesting.

The short-eared owl has a small breeding population which allows them to reproduce among themselves. The long-eared bat faces extinction due to the range-wide impacts of whitenose syndrome, which is a deadly disease affecting cave-dwelling bats across the continent.

One last animal, the king rail, a bird, suffers from losses of marshland habitat. Along with many other animals, this bird needs wetlands in order to exist.

There are many endangered species in Pennsylvania. A lot of causes seem to come from habitat loss, dealing with development in housing and agriculture. Using the best habitat management can help these species from extinction and help the environment.
